Judith A. Lightfoot, DO, FACOI is an Infectious Disease Specialist at Garden State Infectious Disease Associates, P.A. She received her Doctorate in Osteopathic Medicine in 1992 from the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine. Dr. Lightfoot is board certified in both Infectious Disease and Internal Medicine.

She chairs the Minority Task Force for the ACOI which recently put forth a position statement on healthcare disparities and cultural competency. She was awarded the Sam and Betty Glass House Staff Award during her internship. This award is given to the physician who exhibits the highest degree of compassion toward their patient population. Dr. Lightfoot serves as Assistant Clinical Professor of Medicine at UMDNJ-SOM Volunteer Faculty and PCOM, and as a Co-Investigator for AIDS Clinical Trials in Southern New Jersey. She was named one of the top African American Physicians in the tri-state region by the Black Professional Network Journal. Dr. Lightfoot is the recipient of the Apple Award for teaching at UMDNJ/SOM for 2004. Dr. Lightfoot also is involved in the education of teenagers and adults who are at risk for HIV/AIDS. She is dedicated to lecturing at local schools, community based organizations and church sponsored health fairs.
